



Prof. Doz. Dr. med. Claus Cursiefen, M.D.

Prof. Cursiefen is a Consultant Ophthalmologist, Assistant Professor and Director of the Cornea Bank with the Department of Ophthalmology at the Friedrich-Alexander-University Erlangen-Nuernberg. Born in Düsseldorf, Germany, Prof. Cursiefen conducted his medical studies at the Universities of Regensburg and Würzburg in Germany, and subsequently at the Universities of Dundee, Scotland, St. Luke's Hospital, University of Malta, Malta, and King's College Hospital, University of London, UK. After he completed his residency in the Dept. of Ophthalmology, at the Friedrich-Alexander-University Erlangen-Nuernberg, Germany, Prof. Cursiefen received a postdoctoral research fellowship at the Schepens Eye Research Institute, Dept. of Ophthalmology, Harvard Medical School, Boston (USA) and was later a visiting fellow at the Ophthalmic Pathology Laboratory with Massachusetts General Hospital, Harvard Medical School. He obtained his PhD in 2003 on the subject of hem- and lymphangiogenesis in the human cornea. Prof. Cursiefen has received numerous prizes and scholarships, most recently in 2007, a research award from the German Ophthalmological Society, Berlin Germany. He is also a member of various medical associations, including the German Ophthalmological Society, European Vision and Eye Research Association and the American Academy of Ophthalmology.
